An "Add on" license is available in Reading Education for reading specialists and classroom teachers K-12. Eighteen of

these hours can apply toward a Master of Arts degree in Reading, if you enter the graduate program before the end of 9 hours.

The reading program has 3 existing off-campus programs for a Master of Arts in Reading Education. One program is in Hickory at the Metropolitan Higher Education Center, another is in Morganton at Western Piedmont Community College, and the third is in Winston-Salem at the Anderson Center of Winston-Salem State University. In addition, certification courses are offered in Hudson at Caldwell Community College. We first established an off-campus program in the Hickory area in 1991, then moved it to Burke in 1996. We established the Winston-Salem program in 1998. Combined with the on campus offerings, there are four possible locations for courses.
