3. **TK20 Update:**

Robert Dodd, the RCOE Research Associate for Teacher Assessment presented an overview of the Tk20 program. This is a comprehensive data management and assessment system which will enable all undergraduate and graduate programs to integrate and utilize student, program, and unit level data for a variety of purposes, including meeting accreditation and program approval requirements. 4. **Other:**

Dr. Duke gave an update on enrollment for teacher education programs for the Fall, 2009 session. Fourteen percent of the total pool of applicants for freshmen entering ASU in the Fall, 2009 was teacher education students. SAT scores for the pool averaged 1195 with education averaging 1178. There are approximately 944 applicants accepted that have indicated education as their area of interest.

Dr. Duke updated the council on the Professional Core Task Force and presented the new descriptions for the core courses that are currently being considered for recommendation by the Task Force. The Task Force is considering five core courses as a requirement within the 12 hours of study. As of now, only appropriate content is being considered and once that is finalized, then the logistics will be determined. (Documents attached.)
