1. Approval of Minutes from the April 16, 2009 meeting:

2. Proposals:

Reich College of Education:

Department of Human Development & Psychological Counseling

HPC 1: Make the following changes in the Professional School Counseling Program (Major Code: 427* and CIP: 13.1101 and Concentration Code: 427B Elementary/Middle School Licensure and 427C Secondary School Licensure):

- A. Add HPC 5272 Individual and Family Development/(3)S. as a required course.
- B. Increase the number of semester hours for required courses from 42 to 45.
- C. Change the concentration elective hours:
 - a. For concentration code 427B Elementary/Middle School Licensure:
Thesis Option Change from 14 semester hours to 11 semester hours
Non-Thesis Option Change from 18 semester hours to 15 semester hours
 - b. For concentration code 427C Secondary School Licensure:
Thesis Option Change from 14 semester hours to 11 semester hours
Non-Thesis Option Change from 18 semester hours to 15 semester hours

Proposals were approved.

3. Admissions Update: Diana Beasley presented information about the criteria used to accept applications to the University; percentages of the applications completed, accepted, or declined. She gave a power point presentation (see attached) with all the numbers and percentages and also noted that the Admissions Department is

implementing some changes to make information more readily available and more accurate. These changes will also enable a more timely response to applicants with decisions on final numbers being available sooner to those who need this information. After the presentation, there was an open discussion with good response from all those present.

4. Update on Blue Print: Dr. Duke stated that the blue print sent out to Council members earlier this month was only an outline. This is just a framework for assessment not the entire curriculum and there is much work yet to be done. More information will be forthcoming.
